About GRRIPP South Asia

Gender Responsive Resilience and Intersectionality in Policy and Practice (GRRIPP) is a four-year global collaboration and knowledge exchange project funded by the Global Challenges Research Fund of UK Innovative and Research Initiatives (UKRI). Professor Maureen Fordham, PhD., Centre Director, IRDR Centre for Gender and Disaster at the University College London (UCL), UK, is the Principal Investigator of the global GRRIPP. GRRIPP activities are centrally managed through a dedicated UCL Management Team, Coordinators and Thematic Leads. GRRIPP- the Networking Plus Partnering for Resilience is implemented in three regions: Latin America and the Caribbean, South Africa and South Asia.

GRRIPP (South Asia) was launched in 2020 by signing memorandum of understanding between the University of Dhaka, Bangladesh and University College London, UK and awarded to the Institute of Disaster Management and Vulnerability Studies (IDMVS), University of Dhaka. Professor Mahbuba Nasreen, PhD. the Co-Founder and former Director of IDMVS, University of Dhaka and a Visiting Professor of the Institute for Risk and Disaster Reduction (IRDR), UCL, is the GRRIPP South Asia Regional Lead. GRRIPP-South Asia aims to bring together theory, policy and practice to promote a gender-responsive approach to disaster management and development. GRRIPP South Asia is awarded to IDMVS as part of the activities of the Gender and Disaster Network (GDN), Bangladesh Country Hub, which was launched in 2018 at IDMVS with the support of UN Women.



July 2022

Advocating for Tobacco Industry Change

On 21st July, GRRIPP South Asia Regional Lead Professor Dr. Mahbuba Nasreen was a panelist at the National Dialogue on "Smoking and Tobacco Products Usage (Control) (Amendment) Act, 2013. Prof. Nasreen discussed gender differences in the working environment of tobacco production, highlighting wage disparities and domestic and workplace violence women faces. She also discussed how the industry can deal with child labour and how disadvantaged workers can be coerced into criminal activity. She advocated heightened awareness of these gendered challenges and inclusive policy responses.



August 2022

Alumni of Dhaka University in the United Kingdom (UK) organised a webinar to commemorate the 100th anniversary of Dhaka University and Mujib Borsho on July 31, 2022. In the webinar, the regional lead of GRRIPP South Asia, Professor Mahbuba Nasreen, was the keynote speaker of the session 'Role of DU in Achieving Gender Rights and Inclusive Education.' In the session, Professor Nasreen highlighted the need for inclusive education and shared the concurrent challenges that University of Dhaka is facing in achieving gender rights.

The conference took place in the Nabab Nawab Ali Chowdhury Senate Bhaban organized by Bangamata Sheikh Fazilatun Nessa Centre for Gender and Development Studies, University of Dhaka, to celebrate the birth anniversary of Bangamata Sheikh Fazilatun Nessa Mujib.

On 30th August 2022, Raisa Imran, Regional Monitoring & Evaluation Coordinator, participated in the "Stakeholder Meeting to Promote Child Rights of Sexually Abused and Exploited Children" at the Centre for Women & Children Society (CWCS), Bangladesh.

CWCS is one of the GDN network members, and GRRIPP South Asia is exploring the scope of collaborating to ensure child inclusiveness in national policies and practices. CWCS has done this stakeholder meeting under the 'Novel Strategies to Fight Child Sexual Exploitation and Human Trafficking Crimes and Protect their Victims – HEROES' project funded by European Commission Brussels. It is being implemented by 27 consortium partners from Europe, Latin America, and Bangladesh. GRRIPP South Asia plans to circulate newsletters, blogs, and other exciting news with them to expand the network and area of work.





Online Events:

To celebrate International Youth Day 2022, Gender Responsive Resilience and Intersectionality in Policy and Practice (GRRIPP), South Asia, in collaboration with the Gender and Disaster Network (GDN) and Shwapno Youth Development Organization (SYDO), organized a webinar on August 12, 2022, on the broader theme of 'Intergenerational Solidarity to Create a Resilient World.' GRRIPP South Asia Debate Championships

To enhance GRRIPP themes through youth voices, GRRIPP South Asia, in collaboration with Dhaka University Debating Society (DUDS), has organized two debate championships. 14th Nafia Gazi Inter-Department Debate Championship – the University of Dhaka and "GRRIPP-DUDS South Asian Championship 2022" on October 15 and 16, 2022.

The best university debate teams in South Asia competed in GRRIPP-DUDS South Asian Championship 2022, which featured excellent organization, a competitive environment in which one can sharpen their skills for forthcoming major competitions, and a chance to adjudicate among the bests in the circuit.



The notion of the debate sessions covered Disaster Risk Reduction, Climate Change Adaptation, Resilience, Diversity, Inclusion, Intersectionality, Gender, and Disability areas from South Asian perspective. National and international debate teams participated in the GRRIPP-DUDS South Asian Debating Championship 2022. There were 16 teams in total, 9 of which were international and seven national.

The international participating countries were Bangladesh, India, Nepal & Sri Lanka. There were three teams from India, four from Sri Lanka, and two from Nepal. The champion of the event was 'Symbiosis Law School, Pune' from India.



Nafia Gazi Inter-Department Debate Competition is the most prestigious debate tournament among the departments and institutes of the University of Dhaka. As always, this time, it included all the departments and institutes of the University of Dhaka. The primary objective of the competition was to raise awareness about road and city safety, particularly for women.

For this purpose, DUDS wanted to arrange such a debate competition where youth can discuss intersectionality, diversity, making a safe city, and so on. After conducting three rounds of debate and a pre-semi and a semi-final round, two teams qualified for the final. And in the final debate, Anthropology Department became the champion.

On 7th November, King's College London organized a webinar on "Who to trust in a pandemic? The local responses of Bangladeshis and other ethnic groups to government actors during COVID-19" where the Regional Lead of GRRIPP South Asia, Professor Nasreen talked about 'Building Resilience: A Gendered and Intersectional Discourse' as the Keynote Speaker. This workshop brought together researchers in London, Stuttgart, Milan, and



Dhaka to report on and discuss findings from projects undertaken between 2021 and 2022. One of the leading projects of GRRIPP South Asia, Durjog Nivaran, has also worked on a similar theme, "Governance in Pandemic and beyond." Professor Nasreen shared some of the project reflections of GRRIPP while providing her speech.

She spoke about the significance of breast cancer awareness as well as the prevalent precarious conditions of unaware women in South Asia.

NEEDS Conference 2022

Raisa Imran Chowdhury, Regional M&E Coordinator of GRRIPP South Asia, participated in the 3rd NEEDS conference in Copenhagen, Denmark, from 1-3 November 2022. The overall theme for the conference was Global Disasters with a focus on Health and Climate Change and disaster risk reduction and its intersections with development.

As a panel speaker of the session titled "Assessing intersectionality: theory, policy, practice - and



realities?", she reflected her thoughts and experiences through a South Asian lens. This interactive session explored how intersectionality is used in various geographical regions and political contexts, as well as how the integration of intersectionality in policy and practice can be evaluated in terms of its usefulness in challenging notions of power, diversity of knowledge, and social justice.

Event 3:

Professor Mahbuba Nasreen joined the webinar on 'Gender and Agriculture' as a discussant organized by Research Initiatives Bangladesh-RIB and Rosa-Luxemburg-Stiftung South Asia where she reflected on the success and challenges faced by a women worker comparing to a male-dominated livelihood sector. Prof. Nasreen pointed out that despite contributing most to the agricultural sectors, women are not called 'farmers' as most of their activities are conducted within the domestic domain. In addition, she urged the researchers to connect their findings to ecofeminist trajectory and conservation strategies.




Event 4:

Asian Confluence and the US Consulate General, Kolkata, jointly organized a unique Indo-Pacific Conclave on the theme of 'Reimagine and Reconnect: Indo-Pacific synergies through the lens of Culture,' in Kolkata, India, on November 21-22, 2022. The purpose of the conclave was to use culture as a catalyst for policy discussions, thereby contributing to the promotion of an Indo-Pacific region that is free, open, prosperous, and inclusive.

Prof. Mahbuba Nasreen stated that jute is the most environmentally friendly, biodegradable, and compostable fibre. India is the largest producer of jute, while Bangladesh ranks second. As the world shifts towards eco-friendly natural products, the use of jute is also rising steadily. It can replace polythene and other products made from toxic materials. She also discussed the challenges faced by the jute industry and urged policymakers and relevant regional actors to address them. She advised that to meet the region's challenges, it establishes production. distribution, and return-based strategies based on its raw material sources.

Professor Nasreen spoke about 'Strengthening cross-border Supply Chains for resilience and sustainability' theme on the second day of the conclave. Rajiv Bhatia, Distinguished Fellow Gateway House & Member Governing Council, Asian Confluence, chaired the session.



Event 5:

Masuma Moriom, Communication Officer of GRRIPP South Asia, has participated in the 'Bay of Bengal Conversation' as a delegate and represents GRRIPP South Asia. The findings from these two areas have revealed a concerning lack of proper and adequate medicines and specialized treatments within the residents' own homes. Consequently, in their pursuit of receiving proper care and medical attention, respondents prefer to reside in old age homes (OAHs) where facilities are available and affordable.

2.1 Module Validation Workshop by the 'Curriculum Development Team'

One of the awardees from the second phase of GRRIPP South Asia, named 'Reimagining Disaster Pedagogies: Towards Gender-transformative, Socially Inclusive & Intersectional South Asian Didactics' has organized a 'module validation workshop' on May 13, 2023, in the GRRIPP-IDMVS office, University of Dhaka. The main objective of this workshop was to impart training following a participatory approach to integrate the concept of intersectionality in disaster pedagogy. On the 1st day of the workshop, the Regional Lead of GRRIPP South Asia, Prof. Dr. Mahbuba Nasreen took two sessions on 'Understanding Intersectionality' along with 'Gender and Disaster'.

One of the regional board members;,Mr. Mihir Bhatt graced the workshop with his presence & delivered a brief speech on the GRRIPP networking activities & a way forward for the integrated curriculum. The BUP team has invited representatives from Jamsetji Tata School of Disaster Studies (JTSDS), India, who have worked in the 1st phase of GRRIPP South Asia under the curriculum development theme. On the 2nd day, Ms. Lavanya Arvind from JTSDS took a session on 'Infusing Gender Consciousness in Disaster Pedagogies.'

Curriculum specialists from several prestigious institutions, including the University of Dhaka, Begum Rokeya University, Bangladesh Open University, Bangladesh University of Professionals (BUP), and Jashore University of Science & Technology (JUST), actively participated in the workshop as sub-grantees under this specific project. During this workshop, they gained valuable insights into the comprehensive process of implementing the curriculum fellowship programme. On the second day of the workshop, Dr. Dilara Zahid, Director of the Institute of Disaster Management & Vulnerability Studies (IDMVS) at the University of Dhaka, joined the event. She delivered her concluding remarks, encapsulating the key takeaways and insights gathered during the workshop's deliberations. Dr. Zahid's participation and remarks added depth and perspective to the collective efforts to advance disaster management and education within the project's framework.

Field Visit Activities

Centre for Disability in Development (CDD) as one of the awardees of GRRIPP South Asia who has been implementing the project titled 'Participation of Persons with Disabilities in Disaster Risk Reduction: developing a theoretical model for gender-responsive resilience and Intersectionality' conducted a field visit at the Southkhali Union of Sarankhola Upazila, Bagerhat, Khulna from 15th to 18th of May 2023 as a part of their commissioning activity. To create and document Inclusive Community Risk Assessment (CRA) and Urban Risk Assessment (URA) Guidelines, the Community Development and Disaster (CDD) team, in collaboration with a consultant, initiated a series of activities. These activities involved conducting Key Informant Interviews (KIIs), Focus Group Discussions (FGDs), and community consultations with a wide range of stakeholders.



The list of participants included government officials, members of the Union Disaster Management Committee (UDMC), Union Parishad Chairman, elderly individuals, women and children with disabilities, as well as marginalized groups such as the fishermen community.

Her visit aimed to observe and assess the ongoing activities related to the development and documentation of Inclusive CRA and URA Guidelines. She also interviewed the community to know their perception of gender and intersectionality and the need for such an inclusive model for building resilience.
